Kim is the immediate past-president for the California Association of Healthcare Leaders (CAHL), the California affiliate of ACHE. She also serves as the Vice President of the national executive committee for Women in Healthcare, President of Mentis, Napa Valley's Mental Health Non-Profit, and is a member of the Racism in Healthcare task force with the American Nurses Association, California. Kim was recently inducted into Sigma Theta Tau, the national nursing honor society, for excellence in nursing leadership. Additionally, she is authoring her first book, "Pricked, Healing the Heart of Healthcare" scheduled for release in the Fall of 2021.
